| Toiletries Moisture wipes Toilet paper Soap, shampoo, toothpaste, tooth brushes Hygiene items Towels Infant formula and diapers Feminine Hygiene items | Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper – Dilute nine parts water to one part bleach to use as a disinfectant. In an emergency To clean water for drinking, add 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach to one gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners. |

| | Move electronics and valuables away from windows |
| | Fill sinks and bathtubs with water |
| | Use this water for bathing, washing clothes or flushing the toilet |
| | _ Make or purchase ice |
| | Shut off water at the main valve |
| | _ Shut off electricity at the main fuse or breaker box |
| | Watch or listen to local news on television or radio |
| | Be prepared to evacuate if necessary |
| | Keep family neighbors employers/employees coworkers abreast of your plans and location |

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
